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Ship the iPad with many useful applications already installed on it, but to really make the iPad for you, you should customize with applications that you use regularly. The iPad App Store is filled with free and paid apps that you can download to your iPad. Although the instructions in this article apply specifically to iPads running iOS 11, iOS 12, iPadOS 13 and later, the App Store is available on each iPad model. To launch the App Store on your iPad, go to the home screen and tap the App Store icon. The App Store opens on today's screen, which displays a selection of premium and popular apps. Today's screen contents change daily. Scroll down to see the apps Apple suggests. Typically, this screen contains today's application, game of the day, and many related application groups. At the bottom of today's screen (and other App Store screens) are five icons: today, games, apps, updates, and search. Click on one of these steps to go to that section of the App Store. If you want to play games on your iPad, select the games icon at the bottom of the screen to go to the Games section of the App Store. Scroll through the games screen to watch the best games of the week, games recommended by curators, game categories, a list of the top 30 free games, top 30 paid games, and other collections of games. Each game either has a GET button next to it, indicating that it is a free app (free apps may have optional in-app purchases) or an app price. If you see an app that interests you: click an app to open its information screen. For example, to learn more about Marvel Strike Force, click it. On the information page, read reviews and developer reviews and see the graphics from the app. This may help you determine if you want to download it. If you're not interested in the app, go to the top left corner and click games to return to the gaming screen and search for another app. To download the app, click Get (or price on a paid game) to open a download screen. 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Click Search again, and the information screen for this app will be displayed.
